Our April speaker failed to arrive but we had a very chatty meeting giving many members a chance to interact with others. Our next meeting on Tuesday May 2nd in the Church Institute, is our resolutions meeting when we will discuss the subject of CLEAN RIVERS FOR PEOPLE AND WILDLIFE and how the W.I. can help to get relevant policies implemented. We will also have a Coronation quiz, cheesy nibbles and a Prosecco toast to the Coronation ceremony.

CHURCH VIEWS

Most of us will never have seen a coronation before. Even if we were around 70 years ago, the chances are that we would have been huddling around an ancient, rather fuzzy, black & white image on an early TV. Even the King himself will only have faded memories of that event.

This month's coronation of King Charles and Queen Camilla will be a spectacular occasion viewed in high-definition colour all around the world. Twelve new pieces of music are being composed for the service in Westminster Abbey. The crown jewellers have been busy making alterations to the crowns and other royal regalia that will be used. Six thousand members of the armed services will be getting ready to be a part of the parade.

At the heart of all the formal ceremonial, however, will be a Christian act of worship, led by the Archbishop of Canterbury. It's a service marking the beginning of King Charles' reign as our monarch in which we can all take part, through the medium of modern TV. The prayers which shall be said can become *our* prayers as we say 'Amen' in our homes or wherever we are watching. For the coronation is about the monarch's relationship both with God and with his people.

When the late Queen was crowned in 1953, the most solemn part of the service, the anointing of the monarch with Chrism oil, was not broadcast. I am not sure how the BBC will manage that part of the service this time. It depends largely on what King Charles wants. Even if it's not broadcast, I am sure that this ancient piece of ceremonial will be described for us. Chrism is olive oil mixed with some bergamot and blessed by a bishop. It is used to mark the beginning of a Christian ministry, at baptism, confirmation, ordination or at a coronation. It is also used when a new church is being consecrated. Edington Priory Church still has the marks (crosses) where chrism was used to bless that building. King Charles, who is the Supreme Governor of the Church of England, will be anointed with chrism as a Christian monarch, just as his mother was 70 years ago. The chrism is used to make the sign of the cross on his hands, head and chest. We pray that he will be strengthened through the power of the Holy Spirit to fulfil this role to which he was born. Let us join together in praying for King Charles, Queen Camilla and all the Royal Family as his coronation takes place, and let us, with people in this country and others, commit ourselves to service, just as he is doing.

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, bless our Sovereign Lord, King Charles, and all who are in authority under him; that they may order all things in wisdom and equity, righteousness and peace, to the honour of your name, and the good of your Church and people; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

YOUR LOCAL COUNCILLOR – SUZANNE WICKHAM

I hope that everyone had time to enjoy the Easter break and wind down from the busy pace of life that most people lead. We are fortunate that a wonderful country walk is never very far away from us here in West Wiltshire, and even if you must wrap up warm and put your wellies on, there are so many places accessible for us to enjoy. I certainly blew the cobwebs away on the hills above Edington and Bratton over Easter and it was great to see so many people enjoying doing the same thing.

Moving to some practical things that may make people's lives a bit easier, I thought it would be a good idea to highlight how Election processes are changing shortly.

There are no scheduled elections in our areas of Wiltshire in the foreseeable future that I am aware of, but the way we vote is changing from 4th May this year. This will affect elections for Wiltshire Council, Town and Parish Councils, Police and Crime Commissioner and UK Parliamentary and by-elections.

Photo ID will be required at all the above elections at a Polling Station. Only a small minority of people have no form of photo ID such a driving licence, passport, bus pass or other specific forms of ID that are suitable, so this is unlikely to be an issue many. However, to avoid any problems in the future one simple answer is to apply for a Postal Vote. Once you have one it will be continuous for relevant elections unless you cancel it.

I know that some people like the experience of going to the polling station and putting their cross on their ballot paper, but this is not a problem as you can take your postal vote to a polling station, and it will be treated the same as a normal ballot paper.

The obvious benefit of a postal vote is that you have time to vote before the day of the election which can be very helpful if you are going to be away from home or are unable to get to the Polling Station.

Applying for a postal vote is quite simple and can be done online at elections@wiltshire.gov.uk where you can download a Postal Vote application form and return it either online at voting@wiltshire.gov.uk or post it to Election Services, at Wiltshire Council. Full details on the webpage.

You can also contact Election Services by email <u>elections@wiltshire.gov.uk</u> or by calling 0300 456 0122.

If you think a postal vote is a good idea, why not go ahead and apply for yours now? We never know what the future holds and you only need to apply once, but if you are a procrastinator, make sure your application is received at least 11 working days before the next election!

BRATTON NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN – LATEST UPDATE

Since our update in the November edition of this newsletter, the following progress has been made:

- Local Green Spaces We had a great response to this exercise and a short-list of those that meet the criteria set for designation is being prepared for public consultation.
- **Special Views** We also received a good number of nominations to this exercise, several of which overlapped with LGS nominations.
- Community/Heritage Assets Work has also begun to identify other elements that make Bratton special. Some of these are already protected through National Designations such as Conservation Area Status and Listed Buildings, others are more 'locally-valued'.
- Call for Sites 5 sites were nominated by their owners. These will be assessed for technical suitability by independent experts by the end of the Summer. This will provide the basis for an informed discussion about whether or not our community supports their inclusion in the plan.
