## **CHURCH VIEWS**

August is the prime time for people to go on holiday. In many parishes it's a time when the number attending church tends to drop, as they are away for a week or two. However this isn't true everywhere, for there are places which are visited by holidaymakers and where attendances can increase during the summer period. Whilst not being among the most popular holiday destinations in Britain, we do live in a particularly beautiful part of West Wiltshire and there is usually a steady stream of visitors. Sometimes they come for some peace and quiet, sometimes to see the beautiful countryside that we sometimes take for granted. Above all, in August Edington welcomes visitors to the Music Festival, which takes place between 20<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> August.

Welcoming visitors is a really important part of what it means to be a Christian. In the Bible there are numerous instances of hospitality. One of the earliest is when Abraham welcomes three strangers to his tent at Mamre (Genesis 18). After offering them food and drink, the strangers announce that Abraham's wife, Sarah, will bear him a son, despite the fact that she is well beyond the age of childbearing. Sarah, unseen, overhears the conversation and laughs out loud, disbelieving the prophecy. Yet the words of the strangers come true, and Sarah gives birth to Isaac (*Yitzha'ak in Hebrew*), a name that, when spoken correctly, sounds like someone laughing. The strangers are traditionally thought to be messengers of God, or in Biblical language 'angels'. Later, in the New Testament, the author of the letter to the Hebrews writes: "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it." Maybe he was referring to Abraham when he wrote those words.

Many of us locally will be hosting visitors to the Edington Festival for a week. Others have taken on a much greater burden by hosting refugees from the war in Ukraine for many months. Providing hospitality, being willing and open to welcoming others, is a way of witnessing to the love and welcome that God shows us. It is a tradition that goes back thousands of years, and which fulfils the Golden Rule that Jesus stresses in the Gospels: *Do to others as you would have them do to you. (Matthew 7.12)* 

And if you happen to be lucky enough to be able to get away on holiday yourself, remember also that you will be visiting other places and will expect a good welcome there. And if, God forbid, we were ever to experience a major war, there may be a need to look after refugees from among our population, just as we have welcomed Ukrainians and Afghans and others to our shores in recent times. My mother-in-law, now 87, as a child was evacuated from east London to Urchfont in 1939 and still remembers the time when she was welcomed to Wiltshire then!

### YOUR WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR – SUZANNE WICKHAM

#### Wiltshire Council Local Housing Plan

Wiltshire Council has recently released the draft Local Plan document, this is the strategic plan for the County until 2038. This is a positive plan to address needs for new homes, jobs and infrastructure and provides ways to protect the environment and impact upon communities.

This comprehensive plan is based on evidence gathered from consultations conducted in 2020/21, with further consultations before it is approved.

The timeline of the plan requires statutory consultation to start in autumn 2023, for at least 6 weeks, giving residents the opportunity to comment on any aspect of the plan. The results of this consultation will be collated, reviewed and the outcomes considered. In Spring 2024 the plan will go to Full Council for approval, and it will then be submitted to the Secretary of State in summer 2024.

This plan will be the framework for housing and economic growth up to 2038, as well as infrastructure such as roads and schools. It also sets the framework from Neighbourhood Plans and will be the basis on which planning applications are determined. It is a legally required document containing planning policies and site allocations to deliver the Council's priorities, including maximising brownfield sites, and encourages investments to generate high-skilled job opportunities.

Highlights include the commitment to ensure that all new homes meet zero carbon standards, emphasising the importance of high-quality design, together with creating more affordable housing options to better reflect local housing needs, the reduction of the overall housing requirements by 9,000, which will now be based on genuine need. As the plan is until 2038, not all housing will be built immediately, and the plan will only build the number of houses needed. New policies will cover issues such as water resources, air quality and vitality and viability of Town centres, with the aim to secure Community facilities and Town Centre regeneration.

## WILTSHIRE LOCAL PLAN – BRATTON IMPACT

The number of homes which should be built in Bratton before 2038 is increasing, according to the draft Wiltshire Local Plan. The draft document suggests the number of new homes our village needs increase from 40 to 44. However, it also recognises that the village already has a commitment to build 40 of these homes, much of which is met by the new proposed development on Westbury Road. This means the new local plan, if approved, would see the village needing just four additional new homes in the next 15 years on top of those already planned but not yet built. The full draft report can be found on the Wiltshire Council website. The council is due to vote on the plan next year.

#### THE EDINGTON FESTIVAL

The 68<sup>th</sup> Edington Music Festival runs from on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> August until Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> August, with four services a day, three Cathedral and Collegiate choirs, top organists and friends gathering from all over the world.

The theme is 'A Crown of Prayer and Praise', taking its inspiration from the seven-sonnet sequence 'La Corona' by John Donne. This year is the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of William Byrd, so the week includes many of his works but also pieces by Rachmaninov, Matthew Martin, Herbert Howells, Orlando Gibbons and others. As always, the days are book-ended with Matins and Compline, sung to the plainchant by the Schola and the Wednesday Choral Evensong will be broadcast on BBC Radio 3.
