ST JAMES' CHURCH

Easter falls relatively early this year, on the last day of March. From time to time people ask me why it changes from year to year. In recent years there has been discussion about fixing the date of Easter. You would think that might uncontroversial, but it isn't. In the early days of Christianity in this country, there was even a war fought about the date of Easter, as there was a different way of calculating when it should be between the Celtic church and the Roman Catholic church. Their differences were eventually settled at the Synod of Whitby in AD664, with the Roman date being preferred. However there are still differences today between the Gregorian calendar we have used since 1752 and the Julian calendar of the Orthodox churches. So in Greece, Easter this year is on May 5th! Clearly, further discussion will be needed to reconcile different opinions.

The reason Easter moves from year to year is because it is based on the lunar calendar, which Christians inherited from their Jewish heritage. Easter is the equivalent of the Jewish Passover, and so its date is determined by the phases of the moon. As the Passover is a celebration of the liberation of the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt (literally a 'passing over' of the Red Sea, so Easter is a celebration of God leading us from slavery to sin and death to freedom and new life in his promised kingdom.

It is the most important festival in the Christian year, as we remember Jesus' death and resurrection As we journey through this season of Lent, Christians focus more and more on the final journey Jesus took to Jerusalem, to his death on a cross and his rising again. Following Jesus, we find that life is a quest, or a pilgrimage of faith towards the promised new life that Jesus gives us.

We encourage one another along this guest. Some may be just starting out, while others may have journeyed far already. Meeting together and working out just what life means helps us all to travel further. In our parishes, one new way we are doing this is by inviting all who are interested to join a new monthly meeting called 'Quest'. Quest will start on Saturday March 9th in Edington's Parish Hall at 5pm. It's for those of any faith or none, and will explore matters of spirituality and life for an hour once a month. At our first Quest meeting we will be discussing 'Good Food: Bad Food. Does it matter what we eat?' Everyone is welcome, and everyone's views will be respected. Our intention is to invite people to think about important issues and share ideas and challenges with one another. Differences of opinion will be welcomed, but respect for those differences is vital. We won't be trying to 'convert' anyone or tell them that they are wrong.

So, if you can, come and join us at Quest.

POPPY TALKS

YOUR LOCAL COUNCILLOR

Wiltshire Council's new family hub model will start on 1st April 2024, this will enable families with a child or young people person aged 0-19, or 0-25 where there are Special Educational Needs or Disabilities, to access an integrated multi-agency service for help and advice from both an online service and through community hubs.

The hubs themselves will be based in three flagship locations, County Hall in Trowbridge, Monkton Park in Chippenham, and Five Rivers Leisure Centre in Salisbury. In the Ethandune area these will be at Westbury Community Project, Eden Vale Road, and Westbury Library. Staff from different agencies will be available at these locations, working under the Wiltshire Council heading of 'All Together' which is supported by Wiltshire's online platform https://wiltshiretogether.org.uk/AllTogether.

Many services will be available including parenting classes, children's health services, early learning opportunities and one to one family support from a 'family hub practitioner'. A team of 'navigators' will also be on hand to support families to find and access other agencies and voluntary sector organisations, as well as providing practical advice in areas such as returning to work, accessing the Government's free childcare provision and finding volunteering opportunities.

Where a family needs more hands-on support, Navigators will be working with them in their own homes. They will also be in different communities, identifying local needs and ensuring support and services are available in locations that are easier for families to access. The online offer will also include a 'virtual family hub' for families who are unable, or who choose not to access physical buildings. This will include help, advice and guidance resources, alongside the opportunity to take part in virtual services such as parenting skills and child/young person support.

This is an exciting and innovative way of providing services to the people who need them, and in the most convenient way for them. Family Hub staff will be in communities speaking to families, schools, childcare providers and healthcare professionals, and you will see lots of information about this service and a network of QR codes visible throughout the county. The QR codes can be scanned to get instant access to Wiltshire Council's All Together platform. The navigators will also become part of community groups and initiatives, helping communities to support themselves and, most importantly reaching and finding families where they already access services. Asking for help will be quick and easy, and always available whenever it is needed.
